

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF VANSCOY NO.345

BYLAW NO. 4-1998

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE IN THE MUNICIPALITY.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Vanscoy No. 345 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. No dog shall run at large in the Municipality, and for the purpose of this bylaw, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when it is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner, possessor or harbourer of the dog, or beyond the boundaries of any lands where it may be with the permission of the owner or occupant of the said land and when it is not under control by being:
 - a) in direct and continuous charge of a person competent to control it; or
 - b) securely confined within an enclosure; or
 - c) securely fastened so that it cannot roam at will.
 2. A person who owns, possess or harbors a dog found running at large shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this Bylaw.
 3. a) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Bylaw, shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty of:
 - i) First Offence \$75.00
 - ii) Second and subsequent offences \$150.00
 - b) A violator of this Bylaw, upon being served with a Notice of Violation, may, during office hours, voluntarily pay the penalty at the Municipal Office, and upon payment as os provided, that person shall not be liable to prosecution of the offence.
 - c) The Notice of Violation shall be in Form “i” attached to and forming part of this Bylaw.
4. Bylaw No. 4-1997 is hereby repealed.
